ALUMNI WELCOMED HOME IN 90th ANNIVERSARY YEAR

As part of the school's 90th anniversary celebrations, the St. Sebastian Parish Foundation welcomed home alumni and friends of the school at a "Come Home for the 90th" event on Nov. 29, 2019. Current students who are members of the school's Student Ambassadors group were on hand to show off their school. Alumni and their families had fun touring the school and pointing out what was different and what was the same. Alumni also enjoyed having refreshments in Zwisler Hall, where many of them ate countless lunches during their school days.



The visit sparked many memories, some of which our alumni shared with our current students, including having nuns as most of their teachers, going ice skating at Forest Lodge, trudging through snow drifts in Schneider Park to get to school, and eating lunch in Zwisler Hall, where there used to

Alumni will be happy to know that today's St. Sebastian Parish School is thriving, with about 330 students in K-8 and two classes per grade level. As in the past, students attend Mass together as a whole school every Thursday, and they regularly receive the sacrament of reconciliation. During Lent they attend Stations of the Cross every Friday, and in the spring they participate in the May Crowning ceremony. Students and families still enjoy the time-honored St. Sebastian traditions of attending the International Festival, receiving chocolate arrows on the Feast Day of St. Sebastian, receiving candy canes on the Feast of St. Nicholas, wearing uniforms, marching in the Halloween parade, and singing in school programs.

Thank you to everyone who attended the event and to all those who helped everything run smoothly. CLASS OF 1959

Jim also shared some memorabilia of the school's early days, including a picture of the school's first graduating class from 1930. The photo (above) includes his Aunt Margaret Gemind Mosher, the third girl from the right. She is "the only one swiveled in her seat with her legs to the right. She always was independent," comments Jim. When the school opened in 1929, Jim's mother, Dorothy Gemind Hyland (Class of 1935), started 3rd grade while his aunt Margaret started 8th grade. Jim's Uncle Edward graduated in 1939. Jim noted that his grandmother, Mrs. Helen Gemind, was a very active volunteer in the Akron area, and especially for the St. Sebastian Sanctuary Society, helping with Sanctuary events such as parish parties, bridge parties and flower shows. Jim says Fr. Valencheck's book reminded him of many stories from the early days of the parish, including Schneider Park and its connection to the troubling history of the Summit County Infirmary; Bob Kraus, who Jim knew as "young Bob Kraus" (Chapters 2 and



3); Elm Court and Our Lady of The Elms; the pastor of St. Vincent Parish, Fr. Scullen (Chapter 2); the two sons of Bob Humphrey (Chapter 9) and their role in Troop 96 in the 1950s/60s; and classmate Bill McCool '61, who became Rev. J. William McCool and is listed in the book's "Ordinandi of St. Sebastian Parish." Jim also shared photos of lunch tokens from back in the day, "Good for 1 Lunch" at St. Sebastian School.


CLASS OF 1962

Thank you to everyone who has generously supported Project Spruce Up, a campaign to refurbish the school's hallways and stairwells in honor of the school's 90th anniversary.

Phase 1 of the project included the installation of polymer epoxy coating on all 7,150 square feet of the hallway flooring in the school. Phase 2 included repairs and upgrades to the stairwells and the painted portions of the hallway walls.

Project work was completed last summer so the school could start its anniversary celebrations with a splash by welcoming students back to school with shiny new floors, beautifully refurbished stairwells, and fresh paint in the hallways.
