### ST. SEBASTIAN EARNS NATIONAL BLUE RIBBON SCHOOL AWARD

St. Sebastian Parish School is proudly celebrating its recent selection as a National Blue Ribbon School! This honor is given annually by the U.S. Department of Education to high-performing schools across the country for exemplary teaching and learning. St. Sebastian Principal Mr. Anthony Rohr, who guided the school through the lengthy and rigorous application process, says, "This prestigious award is a testament to the hard work and commitment of our students, teachers, staff, parents, and parishioners. It underscores our shared mission of being dedicated to Christ and committed to excellence in education." Pastor Fr. John Valencheck, adds, "I am particularly proud of our students, principal, faculty, staff, families and community for rising to the challenge of this honor during such challenging times in education."

On September 19, when the names of the winning schools were released, Mr. Rohr and Fr. Valencheck orchestrated a special surprise announcement to the students, teachers, and staff, who gathered in Zwisler Hall to hear the news. Then they celebrated with the school band playing the St. Sebastian fight song, doughnuts with blue icing, and a very spirited viewing of the official announcement video from the U.S. Department of Education, complete with raucous cheering once "St. Sebastian Parish School" finally appeared on the screen.

Parents joined the fun a few days after the announcement with a National Blue Ribbon School Celebration on the playground, including blue decorations, blue cotton candy, blue M&M's candies, blue fruit punch, and a DJ playing music. On October 2, Bishop Edward Malesic of the Diocese of Cleveland will celebrate Mass with the community, and Akron Mayor Daniel Horrigan will offer the school a special proclamation.

## CLASSES OF 1950S ERA – FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Over the past few years, Fr. Valencheck has been sharing items he has found in an old filing cabinet in the basement of the parish rectory. In previous issues of the newsletter, we have reprinted several “Forgotten Cabinet” items. Here are a few more of particular interest to our alumni from the 1950s. In a folder marked, “SCHOOL – ATHLETICS,” Fr. Valencheck discovered some interesting tidbits from the 1950-53 basketball seasons. In 1950-51, the boys’ team won eight games and lost six. Team scoring totals for the season were as follows: **Coyle** (110 points), **Iacomini** (86), **Ross** (42), **Conlin** (36), **Reish** (20), **LaMonica** (13), **Nist** (6), **Noble** (5), **Comeriato** (2), and **Klein** (0).

A 1953 roster of the girls basketball team, coached by **Frances Welch** with assistant coach **Elinor Amshey**, listed these players: **Margie Beringer [Dettling]**, **Barbara Bock**, **Carol Collins**, **Frances Flynn [Howard]**, **Judy Haley [Lowe]**, **Mary Jane Hudak [Roberts]**, **Mary Jean Iacomini**, **Joan Lindsay [Saunders]**, **Kathleen McDonald [Seikel]**, **Mary Louise Patsy [Frohnappel]**, **Mary Catherine Skeese [Dawson]**, **Judy Schnur [Carrino]**, **Mary Ann Wrench**, and **Marie Ann Wright [Thomas]**. Fr Valencheck quipped, “I hope that they all had nicknames. If one were to call out, ‘Hey! Mary!’ half of the team would turn around.”

Learning about this story brought back fond memories for Mike, who said, “Our coach was Charlie ‘Chuck’ Zeno, who brought out the best in all of us who played for him.” Mike noted that Chuck and his family became friends with Mike’s parents, and they stayed in touch for many years. Mike adds, “I’m soon to celebrate my 82nd birthday and thank God every day that St. Sebastian’s was part of my life.”

He writes, "I have fond memories of all these schools: Annunciation - going down to the lumber company to get sawdust to put on the floor; St. Sebastian - Boy Scouts, Mr. Beagle, chrome dome, Camp Manatoc; St. Vincent - SMSG textbook (Some Math Some Garbage), trip to Goodyear Labs, learning to play sousaphone, St. Patrick's Day Parade in NYC, kelly green uniforms; Notre Dame - Organic Chemistry, dorm life, mandatory sport coat and bowtie at the dining hall, National Championship in '66, halftime shows, St. Patrick's Day Parade in Chicago; Army School of Music - learning the Army way, parades, marching; Miami U - got my act together, studied hard, published research, and met Barbara, with whom I celebrate 50 years of marriage this coming week. St. Sebastian School prepared me for what came over the next 60+ years."

## CLASS OF 1961

**Peggy Duffy Gallagher**, a parishioner at St. Joseph Parish in St. Joseph, Michigan, received the Bishop Paul V Donovan Founder's Society Award for Outstanding Service from the Diocese of Kalamazoo. Peggy is pictured here alongside Bishop Paul Bradley (center) and fellow award recipient Msgr. Michael Hazard at St. Augustine Cathedral in Kalamazoo. Peggy was recognized for her more than 30 years of service to the Church. She worked as the Director of Sacramental Preparation and Religious Education for St. Joseph Parish from 1985 to 2012 (and also simultaneously for Ss. John/Bernard Parish for nine years). During her tenure she estimates that more than 800 people came into the Catholic Church through the RCIA program. In addition, Peggy taught music at Our Lady of the Lake Catholic School. Her husband, Deacon Michael Gallagher, was ordained to the diaconate in 1999. She was elected to the board of the NDICE representing all deacon wives from the United States to the USCCB for a four-year term. Additionally, she has shared in ministry work with her husband, visiting the sick and the homebound.

## CLASS OF 1964

**Peggy McMullen Cogar** sent in several items for the parish archives, including First Communion group pictures for both her class (1946) and her brother Tim McMullen's class (1966). Peggy also sent items from her First Communion in 1958: a prayer book, purse, rosary, and veil. Inside the prayer book, Peggy has written in her address and her phone number, which was at the time "Temple 62045." Also included are a vintage navy blue uniform, class photos from grades 6-8, and a stack of letters written to Peggy from her former classmates (her family moved to Cuyahoga Falls halfway through her 8th-grade year), which Peggy thinks was probably a writing exercise initiated by her 8th-grade teacher, Sr. John Bosco. And last but not least, she included two report cards, which report some less than excellent grades. "By the way, to my defense," she writes, "I ended up being a pretty good kid and went on to be a nurse and publish two memoirs, so please don't hold those horrible report card grades against me." Peggy adds, "I will always be thankful for the education I received at St. Sebastian School. I have wonderful memories of going to Mass in the small chapel, getting those huge candy cane sticks on the feast of St. Sebastian ... and making best friends with Jeannie Flynn, Evelyn Olson, Colleen Cochran, and Pat Kelly." Renee Longville Conlon '70 and Al Graf '72 received the Fr. Thomas F. Mahar Outstanding Alumni award from St. Vincent-St. Mary High School on Sept. 7, 2023. The following biographies and pictures are courtesy of STVM.



**Renee Longville Conlon '70** and all five of her siblings attended STVM, following in the footsteps of their parents Leo Longville and Sally Delagrange Longville (St. Sebastian Class of 1948). Renee graduated from the University of Akron with a degree in Social Work and then worked for over 12 years in Portage County for their child abuse and neglect department. After her second child was born, Renee raised her children and volunteered in many ways, including as a board member for United Disabilities Services, a coach for her children's teams, room mom and hot lunch coordinator at St. Hilary. Eventually she began volunteering for the Guardian Ad Litem program through the Summit County Juvenile Court, which uses community volunteers to represent the best interests of children involved in the court. As the GAL program grew (it is now one of the largest in the state and nation), Renee was hired as a staff Guardian Ad Litem and worked for 17 years at the court. After retiring, Renee continues as a GAL volunteer, handling two or three cases at a time. In the last year, Renee has also joined the board of the Henry and Laura Huth Charitable Foundation, which is dedicated to providing opportunities and support for at-risk infants, children, and young adults. Over the years, Renee has been very fortunate to have the support of her husband, Jim, and her children, Elizabeth and Nick.





## BRICK ROAD RESTORED ON MULL AVE.

As current school families and parishioners are (perhaps painfully) well aware, Mull Avenue has been under construction for six months, with work having begun in early April of 2023, just after Easter Sunday. The brick road, which runs along the front of the church, has been closed to traffic for most of that time while the City of Akron conducted a major replacement of the road. The roadwork is part of a larger project, which includes new sidewalks and street lighting, a new water main, and a new storm sewer mainline, as well as the reinforcement of existing sewer pipes. Work is ongoing and is expected to be complete before the end of the year, but the results so far are beautiful and much-appreciated!

Alumni will be happy to learn, as evident in the pictures below, that rather than new cement or pavement, Mull Avenue was re-paved using red brick, maintaining the look of the original road. The new bricks were even supplied by the same company, The Belden Brick Company of Canton. The bricks, which were laid by hand, were installed on top of an 8-inch concrete base, which should change the road's reputation for the bumpiest ride in town. The older bricks were saved by the city for re-use on other projects.

The parish held a brief road blessing when the road opened, and our pastor, Fr. Valencheck, made sure his 1946 vintage Plymouth automobile, pictured here, was the first car to travel on the new road. Although Mull Avenue is fit for travel now, please don't rush on by! Follow the red brick road to stop in to see us – we are always happy to offer tours!
