IN MEMORIAM: REV. WILLIAM KARG, CLASS OF 1952, FOURTH PASTOR OF ST. SEBASTIAN PARISH


The Reverend William Karg, who served as the fourth pastor of St. Sebastian Parish from 1995-2008, passed away April 18, 2021. Fr. Karg grew up in our parish, attending St. Sebastian Parish School (Class of 1952) along with his friends Francis LaRocca, Joseph Kraker, and David McCafferty, all of whom would grow up to be ordained priests on the same day: May 23, 1964. Fr. Kraker would eventually become pastor of St. Vincent de Paul Parish, and Fr. Karg, after serving in several Cleveland parishes, ended up right down the street at St. Sebastian Parish, where he was installed as our pastor by Bishop Pilla on May 20, 1995.

Fr. Karg was known as a person who worked for racial harmony, inclusivity and diversity. With other local pastors, Fr. Karg helped establish and support organizations such as the Peter Maurin Center (an

outreach ministry in south Akron) and Nazareth Housing (a non-profit focused on affordable housing). He was also a life-long learner who studied at Case Western University; St. Mary Seminary, Cleveland; the University of St. Thomas, Rome, Italy; the



Jesuit School of Theology, Berkley, CA; Creighton University, Omaha; and the Ignatian Spirituality Institute at John Carroll University.

During his time as pastor of St. Sebastian Parish, Fr. Karg oversaw several major capital improvements, including the renovation and expansion of Monsignor Zwisler Hall, updates to the main school building, the transformation of the convent into the Beringer Center for Early Learning that now houses our preschool and kindergarten classes, and the installation of both the playground and the beautiful fence that wraps around the western end of the campus.

After retiring in 2008, Fr. Karg remained active in the Akron/Cleveland area, directing numerous retreats and providing liturgical services in many parishes, churches and institutions. He also volunteered at the Peter Maurin Center and was a driving force in bringing the Ignatian Spirituality Project to Akron, providing retreats to addicted and homeless people.

Fr. Karg was preceded in death by his parents, Germaine and Frank Karg, and his three siblings, all of whom also graduated from St. Sebastian Parish School: James '43, Thomas '48 and Marie Graham '44. Fr. Karg, who remained active well into his eighties, will be remembered as a welcoming and compassionate person and as a minister to all who had a deep love for this parish and the people of St. Sebastian.


ALUMNI-UPDATES-

Class of 1937

Sarah Jane Witt Kelley enjoyed a visit this spring from Kathy Zehenni Holaday (Director of Development for the St. Sebastian Parish Foundation) and Fr. John Valencheck (Pastor). Sarah Jane recounted how St. Sebastian Parish was the place of many life occurrences for her. She celebrated many sacraments here, including baptism, First Holy Communion, confirmation, and marriage. Sarah Jane and her late brother, Ralph Witt '39, lived on Delia Avenue and walked to school. She attended all eight grades at St. Sebastian and married a fellow alumnus, John F. Kelley '36, who happened to be a neighbor and close family friend. Sarah Jane and John were blessed with eight children (including three St. Sebastian alumni: Sarah Jane Kelley '63, Barbara Vitale '64, and Paul Kelley '65) and 10 grandchildren. Among the many memories Sarah Jane shared are:



• Yearly class plays, garden parties, beautiful processions, visits from bishops Schrembs and McFadden



- Starting 1st grade at the old Knights of Columbus building on West Market Street
- 45-50 students in each class; walking to the beat of the drum when dismissed from class
- Nicknames weren't used students were known by their full baptismal names: For example, Francis Joseph Waickman (a 1937 classmate)
- Sr. Marie gave piano lessons in the convent on the 2nd floor
- Carrying chrysanthemums and Elizabeth "Betty" Dies Falb '37 crowning the Blessed Mother Mary in 8th grade

Class of 1944

When Jimmy McLane, an Olympic medalist who got his start in Akron with Firestone Swimming Club, passed away in December of 2020, he was lauded by the International Swimming Hall of Fame as perhaps the greatest swimming tactician in the world during his time. Jimmy won his first Olympic medals while he was in high school: a silver and two gold medals at the 1948 London games. He won a gold medal at the Helsinki Olympics in 1952 as captain of a relay team. He was also captain of the U.S. team that won three medals in 1955 at the Pan American Games in Mexico City. Jimmy was a local and national sensation who broke records as a 13-year-old. As the International Swimming Hall of Fame notes in his biography (www.ishof.org/jimmy-mclane-(usa).html): "McLane's greatest contribution to swimming was as a high school boy wonder. He was the forerunner of a youth movement that has put U.S. swimming back on top. In those years (1945-1948), he completely dominated U.S. Outdoor Middle Distance swimming with 13 national and 2 Olympic championships." Jimmy inspired many newspaper and magazine articles and even a comic book feature. He was inducted to the International Swimming Hall of Fame in 1970 and the Summit County Sports Hall of Fame in 1958. Jimmy was living in Ipswich, MA with his wife Carol at the time of his death. He is survived by his siblings Timothy and Noel '42, four children, seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.


Classes of 1973-76

Dennis O'Connell '75 wrote in about his former teacher, Charles Thomas Cummins: "Reading the newsletter reminded me of the recent passing of one of St. Sebastian's greatest teachers ever, Mr. Tom Cummins. Mr. Cummins taught seventh grade in the mid-70's. He was beloved and feared, admired more than most -- and deservedly so. He was revered and is remembered with affection. Mr. Cummins had a profound impact on me and the path I chose. I'm sure the same can be said by many other fortunate students." Charles "Tom" Cummins passed away January 18, 2021. Several other alumni wrote notes on Mr. Cummins' memorial webpage, including Timothy Davis '73, who wrote, "I had the privilege of being one of Mr. Cummins' students at St. Sebastian in Akron. He was an exceptional teacher: he succeeded in getting a bunch of 7th and 8th graders to enjoy reading Shakespeare. His classes were engaging and very lively. He brought out the best in us." In the Winter 2018 Alumni Newsletter, Lewie Seikel '73 noted that Mr. Cummins "used to stand on his desk and read excerpts

from the book assignments – similar to Robin Williams' character in the movie Dead Poets Society." And **Sue Preston '76** from Denver wrote, "What an amazing experience having him as a teacher at St. Sebastian, also a little frightening. He instilled in me a love of current events and taught me to raise my hand. Such a caring and dedicated teacher. He will be missed."

Class of 1981

Class of 1984


