## CLASSES OF 1940s-1950s ERA - FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Over the past few years, Fr. Valencheck has been sharing items he has found in an old filing cabinet in the

basement of the parish rectory. In previous issues of the newsletter, we have reprinted several "Forgotten Cabinet" items, and here are a few more pertaining to our alumni from the 1940s and 1950s.

## **CLASS OF 1940**

Fr. Valencheck found a series of entertaining items from the Class of 1940, including the "Class Will," excerpted to the right. The Class of 1940 also reported on the "Fads of the Day" and who started them at St. Sebastian Parish: "Jack Malaney has everyone wearing pork pie hats, with the brim turned up at that! ... Sister Francesca can blame Marilyn (Fichtner) for starting the babushka craze, which is such a bugaboo in Sister's life ... Jim Coulter started wearing brown moccasins, (which he was the first to have) but he's got company, for Jane Homeier has white ones. (Aren't they terrible to keep clean, Jane?) ... Miss **Ellen Keating** has at the neck of her charming blouse, a devastating, eye-catching, simply darling clasp ... When **Donald Albrecht** walks on the grass, you can't tell the difference between his feet and the grass, for Don has, of all things, a pair of green shoes."

## The Class Will, 1940

The first page of the final school paper for the Class of 1940 was entitled, "The Class Will," and was followed by a lengthy list of bequeaths, including:

Joan Dettling wills her baseball ability to Rosie Humphry.

James Coulter wills his colorful sweaters to Sister Fidelma.

Mary Lou Knapp wills her merit cards to Ellen Rohnor.

Donald Albrecht wills his traffic post to Skip Ball.

Pat Motz wills her sister's sweaters back to her.

**Phil Ulrich** wills his knack of making conversation to **Mark Hamlin**.

This document has been examined and found legal. It will take effect June 12, 1940, **Jeanne Schreiner**, Attorney.

### **CLASSES OF 1957-1959**

Fr. Valencheck writes, "The arts have always been important at St. Sebastian Parish. It was Monsignor Zwisler's belief that being in plays, especially, assisted children in becoming comfortable and confident speaking before crowds of people." Fr. Valencheck found a folder that revealed that during the 1951-52 school year alone, eight plays were produced by grade level. This included a production by what was the fourth grade at that time (what would become the Class of 1957) of Cinderella of Loreland. Marcia Goehler played Cinderella, Michael Ahern was Ash her cat, Marjorie Klein was the Stepmother, Mary Kraker was Tilliebell, Frances Martucci played the godmother, and Roy O'Neil was Biff.

In 1955, the 4th and 5th graders put on Mr. Popper's Penguins, a "comedy about a beguiling family addicted to tales of Antarctic exploration who are heirs to two South Pole Penguins. They end up with a flock of them, which threatens to eat them out of house and home. How will they pay the bill collectors for the freezing plants, swimming pool, live fish, and all which are necessary to keep their pets well and happy? But Mr. Popper finds a way!" Cast members included **Kathleen McGuckin (Class of 1959)** (Roberta), **Richard McCready (Class of 1958)** (policeman), **Frederick Martone (Class of 1959)** (penguin), and **Janice Karg (Class of 1959)**.

## **CLASS OF 1973**

**John Glass**, who left St. Sebastian after completing 7th grade, has been in contact with some of his former classmates, but has lost touch with many and would be happy to catch up. He thought it would be fun to send along this brief update on his life since he left St. Sebastian:

In the Fall of 1972, I moved to Japan with my mother and father and attended St. Mary's in Tokyo in 1975. We then moved to Sao Paulo, Brazil, where I attended the School of Mary Immaculate ("Chapel"). I graduated in 1977 and returned to the U.S. I went to Pitzer College in Claremont, California and acquired a bachelor's degree in Sociology. I played in a couple of bands (guitar) in and around Los Angeles and soon realized that I didn't want to be "waiting for my big break" into my 30's, so I decided to forego a career in the music industry. I moved to Texas in 1988 and have been here since. I earned a Ph.D. in Sociology in 1995 from the University of North Texas and worked for non-profits and several local colleges and universities. I retired from Collin College in Frisco, Texas last fall after 17 years of service. Over this past summer, I was awarded Professor Emeritus status by Collin and plan to return to teaching part time in the spring of 2024. Two of my memories of St. Sebastian...Ms. Rudolph used to call me, the "Glass Menagerie," which I didn't understand at the time, but I was honored to have been given a nickname by her, and Ms. [Seikel] (I believe that is who it was), who used to read to books aloud to us in class. That was so calming, and it allowed me to foster my imagination as I had to visualize in my head the characters, the plot, and the action of the narrative. A very fond memory.
