## **WORK HAPPENING AROUND ST. SEBASTIAN SQUARE**

You may have noticed workers around our property. The final repair work to the masonry continues at our 84-yearold rectory building, built in 1938. Workers are sealing capstones to prevent water from entering the structure. At Byrider Hall, a new entry pad and approach has been poured, the front hall carpeted and painted, the bathrooms refreshed and missing doors replaced.

Some other work that is coming up, includes replacing windows on the south side of Byrider and installing new front doors, and, after approval by the Diocese, we will move forward in re-bricking the drives to the rectory and school courtyard. Students and teachers alike should be excited about how great our almost 100-year-old school looks! God bless Monsignor Zwisler and the parishioners of 1928 for building so well!

# LETTERS FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Today we begin a fat, new file entitled, "Parishioner - Mass Request Correspondences." As you may suppose, they are requests for someone or something specific to be prayed for at the Mass. This practice continues to this day as

you can see in the bulletin where the Masses are listed as well as hearing the intention mentioned during the General Intercessions at the Mass. Although the graces of a Mass are infinite and each of us can offer up many intentions, one specific intention may be requested for the priest and community to remember.

When these letters were written, the Mass intention request was \$5. (Today it is \$10.) The stipend for the intention at the Mass is part of a priest's remuneration, although he may only accept one a day (the rest going to charity, the diocese or some other designated use.) On the weekend, a pastor is obligated to pray a "Missa Populo" or Mass for the people of the parish to which there is no stipend attached. If he does not pray that Mass, he must make arrangements for the Mass to be so celebrated.

If you are interested in having a Mass intention, contact Cathy Sivec in the Parish Office at (330) 836-2233 or stop by during office hours. Intentions may include remembering a loved one who has died or a significant anniversary such as for a marriage or birthday or in thanksgiving for healing or prayers answered.

Here is the letter, originally written in blue ink:


