FESTIVAL THIS WEEKEND!

This Saturday is Chris Fest from 4 to 9PM. There will be live music, food, drinks and more! This eventis held annually to remember Christopher James Consilio (Class of 2011) and to support the Christopher James Consilio Memorial Fund established at the foundation, which funds scholarships for 8th graders at St. Sebastian Parish School who plan to attend St. Vincent – St. Mary High School. The fund also provides grants for teachers at St. Vincent – St. Mary High School and St. Sebastian Parish School that support student enrichment as well as to make grants available for community organizations that support and/or sponsor fentanyl awareness programs.

ANNUAL EUCHARISTIC DEVOTIONS

From September 11-13, our Lord will be in the monstrance on our altar, day and night, hoping to spend an hour or any spare time you have with Him.

To that end, we will need adorers around the clock these three days. It would be ideal to have at least two people at all times, particularly during the night. You may adopt an hour (or more) on the sign-up sheets located on the altar rail in front of the Blessed Virgin Mary statue. Please pray for the success of our Eucharistic Devotions.

SPEAKING OF THE EUCHARIST

By now you may be aware that the Catholic Church in the United States is entering into a three-year Eucharistic Revival. The Bishops wisely concluded that if the Church were going to go through a sort of revival, we would have to begin with a refocusing on the Eucharist, the center of the life of the Church on earth. There was an earlier one (from before the family move) from Mr. Coyle, hand written on company letterhead:

Enclosed is a check for 25th anniversary Mass and I would like to have you say some Masses of Thanksgiving for us after the anniversary which you know is on Saturday, August 7th.

For the Thanksgiving Masses just announce them without our name. I would appreciate it if you would let me know when they will be. Thank you for your many favors.

The Bridge Club of the parish still makes donations to the parish. This past year they made a donation to cover the cost of some new trees to be planted this fall. Thank you, Bridge Club! As a side note, the very first fundraiser for the parish held in 1928 was a Bridge Party!

Here is one final letter for this week typed on business letterhead:
