
LIVE-STREAMING UPDATE

Our many trees make it difficult to see the west side of the roof so on Monday night I climbed our bell tower to take a couple of pictures for you. LETTERS FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Our next file is very thin and will only take this one posting to cover. The title of the folder is, "PARISHIONERS: FORMER". In it are a few letters explaining why individuals are no longer parishioners since they have relocated out of town.

Dear Father Zwisler,

I am very sorry to announce to you that my family and I have moved out of your parish into Marietta, Ohio. Moving out of St. Sebastian Parish was the most difficult part of all of our breaking away from Akron as I know we will not be able to find a pastor and parish as progressive, yet deeply reverent, as you and St. Sebastian. We regret sincerely that our three children will not be able to take advantage of your wonderful school. (...)

The Potts family moved to San Bernardino, CA hoping for more healthy climates though they "will always have fond memories of St. Sebastian." With much regret, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Herman "temporarily" moved out of the parish but hope to return, "to build our home on Thorndale where I have a lot." William Girgash moved to Ravenna (1950) and became a member of Immaculate Conception and so requested that envelopes no longer be sent to him though "we truthfully can say that we thoroughly enjoyed every service in your church and regret having to leave." George Flanagan's work took him to Cleveland and the Gerard Couley family regretted not having time to say goodbye before they left but wanted to express, "how much we enjoyed being in your wonderful parish and glad our children were able to be baptized by you."

In 1950, Miss Anna Beene needed to leave the St. Sebastian neighborhood to take care of family and would now be attending Sacred Heart Parish on Grant Street. "I enjoyed the services at St. Sebastian very much and I hope to be able to attend the Pre-Easter and Pre Pentecost-novenas again." 1953 found Alice Dannemiller Henry (Class of 1942) and her family moving to Norfolk, VA about which she wrote, "We have a very lovely home here and are now in the Lady of Victory Parish. The chapel is just a Quonset hut on the base but the chaplain has succeeded in making a very effective church of it."

As a side note, the current Archbishop of the Military Services is a Cleveland native, Archbishop Timothy Broglio, originally from Cleveland Heights. Money is tight and so the Catholic chapels are not necessarily architecturally beautiful or well furbished. As parishes closed in the Diocese of Cleveland, the archbishop procured sacred vessels and artwork to adorn various military chapels and parishes for the benefit of those who give of themselves to serve our nation. 
