
### **CONSTRUCTION UPDATES**

The construction crew has been taking the shingles off our two bells towers in preparation for replacing the roof. One roof is over 60 years old and the other is nearing 100 years old. Despite the many years of direct abuse in northeast Ohio weather, the roofing decks were in fine condition!

The re-bricking of the drives off of Elmdale has been postponed due to some difficulties on the installer's side. Work should begin closer to the beginning of the new year.

Also, Keep Akron Beautiful, Akron's Finest Mulch and St. Sebastian Parish and other interested individuals are teaming up to make improvements to the center of the Mull/Hawkins circle. The hope is to raise the center, and the light and add a local art piece that will not only beautify but also make safer the circle particularly at night for unfamiliar drivers.

Mr. Thomas LaRose, for whom we recently had a funeral Mass and who was a mere two months older than the parish, was a founding board member of Akron's Keep Akron Beautiful. So, it is a fitting tribute that KAB is now helping beautify the circle as it will help make the St. Sebastian Parish neighborhood even a greater place to be.

#### FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

If there was ever a question as to why we need more men to step up to be Catholic chaplains in the military, this letter would be a fitting answer.

#### **U.S.S. YORKTOWN**

MARCH 21, 1945

Dear Mrs. Lueck,

You have already received word that your son Robert was killed on board this ship as a result of enemy action. I was with him from the time he was wounded and can assure you that everything possible was done to save his life. He was perfectly conscious for several hours, and during this time, I heard his confession, administered Holy Communion, and gave him the last sacraments. He remarked at the time that he was greatly consoled by the presence of Jesus Christ and regretted that he had not been more faithful in the practice of his religion. We talked on at some length about you and home, and finally he said: "Father, why are you spending so much time with me?" During the hours of consciousness, he was never in great pain as the doctors made him as comfortable as possible. His one great desire was to talk, and his thoughts and expressions were truly beautiful: in fact, I said afterward that he had preached to me a more effective sermon than I could ever hear in church. He never complained and made no reference to his injuries. During the course of the night, he lapsed into unconsciousness, and died peacefully in the grace of the Lord, with the corpsmen and myself offering the prayers for the departed.

My association with Robert was short, as he had not been with us for a long time. But he won my lasting respect, and I can assure you that he was highly regarded by his officers and shipmates. We buried him as sea yesterday with full military honors, and with a Catholic service of commitment, and then offered a Memorial Mass for his soul. No one could have gone to his Maker better prepared. I pray that this knowledge may lighten your burden and sorrow, and that God might give you the same strength to accept His will. In a time like this, we must turn to the words of Christ: "He who believes in Me, although he shall be dead shall live; and everyone that lives and believes in Me, shall not die forever."


