THIS JUST IN FROM THE BISHOP

Effective immediately, our Bishop is lifting the ban from distributing the Precious Blood at Mass. After consultation with the Catholic Medical Association, it has been determined that it appears to be safe to return to the use of distributing the Precious Blood at Mass. We may not start up immediately on the weekends since it requires a large number of people (about eighteen additional extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion) to be able to do it properly. 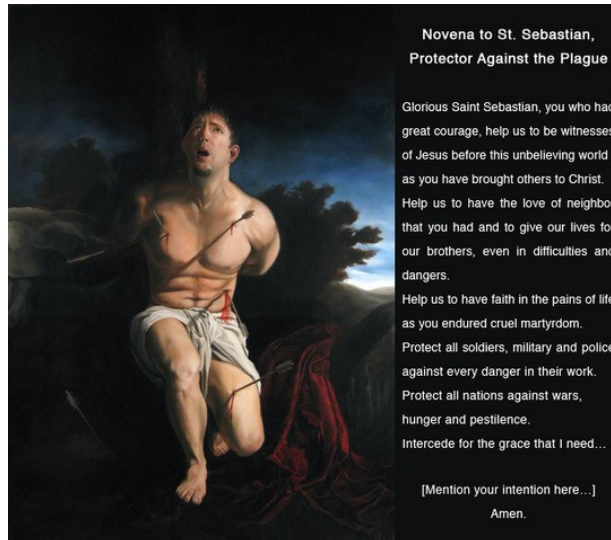
