WORK AROUND ST. SEBASTIAN SQAURE

Starting Monday of this week you may have noticed large trucks on our block of Mull Avenue. The trucks and workers huddled around the manholes. This is the beginning of the Mull Avenue repaving project, the first part of which is to repair the storm and sewage lines. These two lines are being reconstructed by machinery through the manholes, which means that the street does not need to be torn up, as it will need to be for the water line project. So far, for week one, the Mull Avenue project, is right on schedule!

You may remember that reported here earlier in the year, we were expecting a stone path to be established around Schneider Park. So far there is nary a stone in sight. The last time we spoke with a representative of the city, he said that the equipment that they purchased for the construction of these paths around the city is missing a vital component due to "supply chain difficulties" and that maybe we could look forward to the path being set in place this spring. This leads me to the next story.

There must have been a rush on liturgical wine now that the bishop has allowed the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass. We received news that it is backordered. This just makes me marvel all the more at how little I underestimated what it would take to bring the parish back up to full operation! From the title, one might think this week's folder would be full to overflowing. But it is not. "PARISHIONERS - OBITUARIES" only has one obituary in it! Well, actually two, from two different Akron papers for the same person. As near as I can tell, it took place in 1928 (there is no date on the clippings) because although the funeral was for St. Sebastian Parish, it took place at St. Vincent Parish, St. Sebastian church not being ready for service until the following year.

Just for fun: Here are the two articles. Please note that the unfamiliar spellings, abbreviations and capitalizations are in the original:

MICHAEL FLYNN IS BURIED SATURDAY

Pastor of New St. Sebastian Church Conducts Services at St. Vincent

Funeral services were held Sunday morning at 9 o'clock at St. Vincent church for Michael Flynn, 57, former director of labor at the B. F. Goodrich Rubber Co., who died suddenly Thursday morning at his home, 512 Dorchester rd.

Rev. Hilary Zwisler, pastor of the new St. Sebastian church, of which Mr. Flynn was a member since the separation of the new congregation from St. Vincent's church, sang the requiem high mass. Burial was in St. Vincent's cemetery.

Fourth Degree Knight

Mr. Flynn had lived in Akron for the past 30 years. He was a past grand knight and a faithful navigator of the Knights of Columbus of which he was a member of the Fourth Degree, and he was a member of the Elks, City, and Portage country clubs. For several years he was active as a member of the executive board of the Akron area of boy scouts.

Besides his widow, he leaves a daughter, Mrs. W. A. Clark, 465 Orlando av., and a son, William, 80 Bittman st.

MICHAEL FLYNN TAKEN BY DEATH AFTER ILLNESS
Prominent in Rubber Industry
For Last 25 Years; Demise
Unexpected

WORKING ON INVENTION

Former Goodrich Official Had Long, Active Career in Business, Civic Worlds

Michael A. Flynn, 56, prominent in the rubber industry for a quarter of a century, died unexpectedly in his home, 512 Dorchester rd, at 4 o'clock Thursday morning as a result of heart disease.

Mr. Flynn had been slightly ill for about a week but had not been confined to his bed.

Early Thursday morning, after an almost sleepless night, Mr. Flynn called his wife as he suffered the fatal heart attack while in the bathroom.

His wife quickly summoned medical aid, but Mr. Flynn sank rapidly and died a few minutes later.

His life was one of constant activity in the business, social and civic worlds

Son of Ireland

A son of Old Erin, he came to America with his parents when two years of age and settled in Massachusetts.

Here he remained until 30 years ago, when he left Revere, Mass., a suburb of Boston, to come to Akron with A. H. Marks, former Goodrich official.

Mr. Flynn became foreman of the bicycle tire department of the Diamond Rubber Co., and at the consolidation of the B. F. Goodrich Co., became assistant superintendent.

After years of service, Mr. Flynn was named director of labor and in this capacity until three years ago, when in rounding out 26 years of active service with the company, he resigned to work upon an invention.

For the last three years, Mr. Flynn had devoted his time in working on a new mold for the large tube of a balloon tire.

Although leading an extremely active life in the business world, Mr. Flynn was prominent in civic, church and social

circles.

Active Roles

Throughout his career he had engaged actively in many of the most important of Akron's civic movements, being particularly active in Boy Scout and welfare work. He was prominent in the promotion of the recent completed St. Thomas Hospital.


Since coming to Akron, he had been a member of St. Vincent's Catholic Church until recently when the new St. Sebastian Parish was organized in the western section of the city, he became affiliated with the infant organization.

Mr. Flynn was past navigator of the Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus, past Grand Knight of the Akron Council, Knight of Columbus, member of the Akron City Club, Elks and executive board, Akron Area, Boy Scouts of America

Funeral services will be held in the St. Vincent's Church Saturday morning at 9 o'clock. Rev. Hilary Zwisler, pastor of St. Sebastian's will officiate. Burial will be in St. Vincent's Cemetery

Members of the Knights of Columbus will meet at their clubrooms Friday night at 7:30 o'clock and go to the home to pay their final tribute to their dead comrade.

Update: Opening up our sacramental books it is discovered that Mr. Flynn's was the 4th funeral celebrated at St. Sebastian (see picture below.) This was immediately followed by the death of Janet Ransweiler, three years of age. Other last names from that first year of the parish that still resonate today are Cahill, Jahant and O'Neill.


