This weekend is the Solemnity of Christ the King. This feast day marks the end of the Liturgical Year. Next week we begin the new Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent. FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

This section is called "Correspondences" and starts in the year 1958 and stretches back to 1930. Opening up the first file (1954 - 1958) reveals about a dozen letters mostly concerning bill payments, requests for Tax Exemption Certificates and a few thank yous.

The Ohio Bell Telephone Company Directory Department wrote to say,

Dear Miss Hohman (Note: Was she the parish secretary at the time?)

Thank you for your application for the directory advertising in the fourth coming issue of the Akron Classified Telephone Directory. We are sure that you have made a sound decision to advertise in the YELLOW PAGES, the nation's number one buyer's guide.


The attached invoice showed that it cost 75 cents a month and that the Sunday Mass schedule of 6:00, 7:15, 8:45, 9:45, 11:00 & 12:00 would be printed.

The Newman Mother's Club, the Junior Class at St. Thomas Hospital and "the Ladies of the Theta Phi Alpha Mothers' Club" sent "Thank yous for use of parish rooms for their events. The "Strong, Carlisle and Hammond Company" wrote Fr. Zwisler to inform him that the problems he was experiencing with his dishwasher was his own problem since, "on checking the sales invoice for this machine we find that there was no service warranty included."

Finally, Mr. H. H. Root, president of the A. I. Root Company (from where we still purchase our candles and often receive a sample of their honey) wrote Monsignor in 1955 to say:

Mr. Walsh tells me that you did not particularly like the last honey that we sent over to you. This shows that you know good honey and we regret very much that owing to several years of drouth and below normal money crops almost the country over, the quality of most honey crops has declined considerably. During drouth years, the bees are forced to go far afield, and they work on a number of plants that are usually classified as weeds. A garden pest, very prevalent over the country is what is known as heartsease or smartweed. A little of this added to light colored honey produces a blend not too pleasing in flavor or color. In sending you the best we had, it was probably none too good, if the truth were known, but it was lack of rainfall, mainly, that caused the lowered quality.

There has been a much better honey crop this last season and while we are not yet quite satisfied with our own honey, we think we shall have some in very soon that can be classed with the best. We could send you some of our own right now, but I fear you would think it not much of an improvement. A little later on we can do better.


