# FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Most of the folders stretching from the last report back to 1937 are empty and what letters there are, do not prompt much interest save for one that was so scandalous that it seems rather inappropriate to print it almost eighty years later! It was a letter from a company that was trying to save its reputations after a "disgruntled employee" went around besmirching their name. The letter practically burned with anger. "Only a particular sadistic desire could lead anyone to exhibit a letter of such vindictiveness to (us) the victims!"

A more pleasant letter was from the Zenith Radio Distributing Corporation of Chicago who reports, "In every parish there are a number of person who, because of being deaf, remain away from the sacraments. Up until the present time (1938) many parishes have not been able to install hearing aids in the confessionals because of the expense involved. Here at last is the answer to this problem. Zenith Radio Corporation has perfected a new hearing aid particularly adapted to this use. It's the Zenith Ravox which sells at the phenomenally low price of \$29.50."

An advertising brochure attached shows a machine about the size of a small heater with headphones attached, all of which must be plugged into the wall. A testimonial declares, "With Ravox I heard the neighbor's cock crow!"

Most of the rest of the letters involved information about orders and prices from companies. Some of the names are the A. I. Root Candle Company, with whom we still do business, The A. Polsky Company, who, in 1938 requested the opportunity to bid on the furnishing of the new rectory, The May Company, the M. O'Neil Company and others less familiar.

One final letter was from the United States Post Office. "Your request for easier delivery is under consideration and if a practical solution can be worked out, you will be advised. As the routes are now laid out it would require the carrier to traverse Elmdale the second time. Further effort will be made to comply with your request in the near future."


