FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

Before we get to today's letters, here is some feedback concerning previously shared items:

Louise Hellwig sent this in: "Regarding your January 5th newsletter, I really appreciate it because it gave me the incentive to call Father Yahner's sister-in-law who is a really good friend. You are correct in that Don Yahner was Father Gordie's dad. And Joyce confirmed that he worked with the Fairlawn Supply Company."

Thank you for sending that in! Also, thank you to Karen Bader and Marcy Smith who brought in art pieces painted by Sr. Matilda O. P. and apparently purchased by family members in 1933 at the Our Lady of Elms pre-holiday art sale as mentioned last week. It was fun to see her work. Thanks!

The folder for 1932 has many more letters in it, but I really like this first one for some reason. It is a hand written letter from Lucille Agar dated February 23, 1931:

Dear Sir,

I am the young lady who phoned you recently regarding the lightening conductors. I drove past the school yesterday and admired them very much, only I feel you are greatly in need of protection from lightening.

Our new system, which is installed on the Capitol and White House in Washington, is very nice to look at. It consists of short points about 13 in. high and unless you are looking for them you cannot even see them. Our system is also installed at Washington's Monument and it has been struck three times and no damage.

I expect to call you Thursday eve. at 7p.m. and in the meantime if you have the opportunity to inspect any of our work you will find it the finest available.

One home in Fairlawn district left unprotected was struck by lightning and damaged \$3,000.

The Central Depository Bank in Akron is also protected with our system.

Stapled to this letter was a business card of W. G. Agar, Dealer and Erector of HIGH GRAD LIGHTENING CONDUCTORS, 44 years in business with "Materials and workmanship endorsed by Chief Weather Bureau of Washington D. C."

There was a second business card stapled under this one that reads:

JANE LUCILLE AGAR PRIMADONA

Maude Adams, A Kiss for Cinderella Co. Hitchy Koo Green Village Follies Blue Eyes Clinging Vine Co.

SO, interestingly enough, these are all really things that at first made me laugh aloud. Then I looked them up online and Lo and Behold! (The first three have links attached to them.) Apparently, Ms. Agar was really something on stage! I will leave it to you to look up the remaining ones.

Monsignor wrote back (we have the carbon copy of the letter):

Dear Madam:

We wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter concerning lightening conductors. Unfortunately, the writer was not of town last Thursday evening when you called. We shall be glad to receive your quotation on a lighting conductor for the chimney on our school building. We are obtaining quotations for some also from other sources.

One last side note: If you look closely at our school building, you will find lighting rods that seem to match the description mentioned in the letter, though whether they are of the Ager Co. or not would need more research. But, I would like to point out that our school chimney is a bit shorter than when it was built! Original plans and pictures show a higher chimney with some ornate stonework. But whether that was due to badly needed tuck-pointing or a lightning strike I do not know!


