CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK OPEN HOUSE



Dear Sirs:

Below is the cost of repairing the sidewalk broken by the driver of your delivery wagon while delivering some goods to our school building last August.

From Fairlawn Supply Co. 1 piece of blue flagstone \$7.50 V. G. Faris (Stonemason) 93 Atlas St. 4 hours labor @ \$1 \$4.00 Nick Shero (Helper) 500 Mull Ave. 4 hours labor @ .40 \$1.60 TOTAL: \$13.10


