# ASH WEDNESDAY

This coming Wednesday, February 22nd is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Masses on Ash Wednesday are at 9:00a.m. (with school), 5:00p.m. (Latin) and 7:00p.m.

## FAST AND ABSTINENCE PRACTICES BEGIN

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 to 59. Fasting permits one full meal as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to the full meal. Abstinence from meat is binding for all over the age of 14. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.

#### LENTEN MISSION

Our Lenten Mission will be March 12th through the 14th in the evenings at 7:00p.m. in our parish church. Free copies of the book "Pray 40 Days" were distributed after all Masses. It was written by the Rev. Michael Denk who is a priest of the Diocese of Cleveland and also our Mission Director. The book goes along with our Mission and explains itself and how it is to be used. #### COMMUNION

During the time of COVID, because so much was unknown about the illness, some of our practices concerning the distribution of Communion became slightly lax both to allay some concerns and to make sure as many people could receive Communion as possible. Now that our fears are largely allayed, please reinstate the following if receiving Communion on the hand:

One is only permitted to receive in the hand if one's hands and arms are completely unencumbered. If a person is holding a hymnal, purse, child or any other such thing, or if one is on crutches, has a cast or has soiled hands, that person should receive on the tongue. Gloves should be removed and sleeves that extend over the palm should be pushed up.

It is also good to remember that one hand should clearly be on top of the others so that the person distributing can easily tell onto which hand to place Our Lord. We are called upon to receive with the non-dominate hand (the hand not used for writing) with the dominant hand directly underneath. After receiving, the communicant steps to the side and receives the host by use of the dominant hand.

Thank you for your consideration in this most important matter.
