I'm honored to have been on your distinguished series, and I truly enjoyed bringing that music to life in such a stunning space and on a marvelous instrument. I was remarking afterwards in the greeting line that your Kegg-Schantz (organ) shows the mark of an excellent builder – complete in its tonal palette yet offering so many surprises (like the *vox* and that delightful flute on the positif!) Furthermore, the voicing of the pipework is so thoughtful and makes for an outstanding blend in the 'room'. I was delighted by the audience turnout, but even more so by the audiences' responses afterwards - commenting on the organ's rich colors, their insight into the repertoire, and their adding St. Sebastian to their list of concert series to keep an eye on.

KUDOS TO OUR SCHOOL FACULTY, STAFF AND STUDENTS

This past year, Mr. Rohr and a dedicated troupe of teachers applied for the Blue-Ribbon status for our parish school. "The coveted National Blue-Ribbon School award affirms the hard work of students, educators, families, and communities in creating safe and welcoming schools where students master challenging and engaging content." The winners of this award for this year will not be known until September. What we do know at this point is that our school qualifies academically to have been able to apply in the first place and that we have since made it to the next level of consideration. Great job team!

SENATE BILL NO. 11 - PARENT EDUCATIONAL FREEDOM ACT

Here is a brief overview of how this bill could affect you and our parish:

1. SB 11 calls for every Ohio student to be eligible for scholarships of \$5,500 for grades K-8, and \$7,000 for grades 9-12 to be used at any chartered non-public school that accepts the EdChoice scholarships.

2. This enables the state's education formula to support the education of students where their parents want them to attend.

3. All local taxes still stay with the local public district, even if they have fewer students to educate. The scholarship is funded only by the state's share of the funding formula, which is supported by all of our taxes.

4. The bill increases the homeschooling expenses that a taxpayer can claim income tax credit from \$250 to \$2,000 a year.

There are significant benefits to this bill both for our parish, school and for those of you who home school. It should greatly ease the subsidy the greater parish must give to the school while also allowing us to give our hard working, dedicated and talented teachers more competitive pay. Mr. Rohr is already putting into place stringent student application policies so that our school remains Catholic, community oriented and academically strong should this legislation pass.

MULL AVENUE CONSTRUCTION UPDATE IMPORTANT: PLEASE READ

On Tuesday morning, a meeting was convened between The City of Akron, Kenmore Construction and St. Sebastian Parish to discuss changes to the calendar of the Mull Avenue construction project. This news is a bit more up to date than the bulletin information since that is written and sent to the printers on Monday.

Starting this Monday, March 13th, work will begin on the water main project along the north side (Forest Lodge side) of Mull. It will begin at the circle and progress to the east. This will require a trench, done in sections, that will take up about 4' of the north side of Mull Avenue. East bound traffic should be maintained throughout this part of the project. This means that there should be **no change for drop off or pick up for the school. Furthermore, parking and traffic for Sunday Masses should be maintained**. We have been asked to warn our school parents who pick up their students along Mull Avenue to be aware that, **although the road may look as though it is closed off**, you may still come that way to pick up your student. Please drive slowly and attentively since it is a work zone.

The big change will come with Easter Monday. The tear up of Mull Avenue was to begin immediately, but we were able to successfully negotiate having this part of the job held off until after Easter. Beginning the Monday after Easter, Mull Avenue will be ripped up for a period of about three months and be completely closed off to traffic. We are currently working on a plan to assist us through this difficult period. Please keep an eye out for access, parking and student drop off/pick up plans which will be coming soon.

We were told the delay in the beginning of the water line project and the speed up of the paving project was largely a result of labor issues. The upside is that with this new schedule, though the worst of it will take place during the school year, it is currently estimated to be completed earlier than originally anticipated and at the end, not only will we have a beautiful, new, brick road, but new sidewalks, lighting, signage and greenery.

The length of the project has also been expanded. Originally ending at the end of "Y" in the road at the far side of Schneider Park, the project will now extend to Clemmer Avenue.

For those who are interested, the project is largely being headed up by Kenmore Construction. The brick surface will be laid by Vizmeg Landscape. As of this writing, we are still anticipating our school brick drive to be replaced

the week after Easter.


