## EXTRAORDINARY FORM

We had our meeting with Bishop Malesic this past Friday concerning the future of the Extraordinary Form of the Mass in the Diocese of Cleveland. The long and the short of it is this: we were told to hold the course until September since no word has been received from Rome as of yet.

Our Bishop has requested that all twelve parishes be able to continue as they have until September at which time, he hopes to consolidate that number to three locations: Cleveland east, west, and one location south (Akron). He is in consultation with the Institute of Christ, the Sovereign High Priest, whose charism is to celebrate the Extraordinary Form, in the hopes to bring them to the diocese. That would entail changing a parish in Cleveland into a shrine, in order to fulfill the pope's mandate. That would leave the question of the other two locations in doubt since, at the moment, they would take place in parishes.

In the end, all possibilities are still on the table: We could have twelve locations, three, one or we might receive a cease-and-desist order. All will depend on if Rome will accept our Bishop's requests.

Our Bishop has asked us to pass along to those who worship at this Mass that he does care for you and desires to do what he can to ensure the long-term celebration of this Mass and other sacraments within the diocese if that option is given to him. He is also aware that there are other churches in our diocese that carry the title Catholic, but do not have faculties to perform sacraments nor are they tied in any real way to the bishop or the pope. This awareness will mean sacrifices may need to be made and that is not an easy thing. To explain this further, there is an excellent episode on "Pints with Aquinas" that I highly recommend that you can find <u>HERE</u>. I hope that it assists you in your discernment. Know of my prayers.

#### FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

There is a very thick folder marked, "ARCHBISHOP HOBAN HIGH SCHOOL: BOYS ATTENDING". The first letter in the file concerns the registration for the first year of classes in 1953. A fact sheet was sent out to area pastors to help get the word out about the new high school. Among the different points were these:

+ Classes would be held in a space provided by St. Bernard Parish for the first year.

+ They will limit the first class to 150 boys due to space limitations at St. Bernard Parish.

+ There will be no entrance exam (as of yet) but, "Pastors could be most helpful in helping us eliminate doubtful cases . . ." (Something I am very grateful that is not asked of me today.)

+ Extracurricular activities would include sports, music, public speaking and student publications.

+ We may seem unnecessarily adamant about pre-payment of fees, but we must prevent the merely curious or disinterested student from excluding another who is sincerely intent upon evening our school.

Please remember this new foundation in your Masses - God's Blessing of this apostolate will be our measure of success.
