There is not much interesting in the "SCHOOL BUILDING MAINTENENCE" file. There are pamphlets for Fyr-Fyter fire extinguishers (horrible name) in business since 1929, an advertisement for steel radiator furniture (the pictures I recognize from sightings around the campus) and a parts list for UNIVEX (whatever that is.)

Perhaps the only remotely interesting thing is a list of paint for the school. There are colors such as "French Ochre," "Burnt Umber in Japan" and "Spanish Whiting." I wonder what those colors are being called nowadays.

Perhaps the most interesting color is "Bottle Green" outdoor paint. All of the exterior window frames, doors and the trellis that connects the rectory to the school were once GREEN! When some paint is chipped on the trellis it is still possible to see this color. Actually, there were two different versions, one darker than the other. From what I have been told, it was once fashionable to paint such things to give them the appearance of oxidized copper. Though very interesting, I don't think we shall return to that color scheme.
