# WORK AROUND ST. SEBASTIAN SQUARE

Starting next week, we will begin plaster repair work in the church. The estimated amount of time for this project is one to two weeks. On Tuesdays, when they cannot work in the church due to adoration, the workers will also begin plaster repair work in the rectory which is long overdue!

Joanie and I took a walk through the Good Park development (Perkins) and noticed that all the traffic signs have been installed. The poles for the street signs are ready for the names to be added. The streetlamps are in place, but we've not seen them lit up. Work continues on Mull Avenue preparing for our streetlamps. Workers are outside this morning (Tuesday) digging in the devil strip and laying wires and power boxes.

Fix up work has begun on the Elmdale house. You may have noticed that our maintenance staff took down the wire fence that surrounded the property. It appears to have been a relief to our neighbors, who thanked our staff. Slowly you should see more progress on this property.

FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

One of the biggest problems in the 1957 school year was the increasing growth of Catholic schools during the Baby Boom. In this file are letters from the city concerned about the number of students that must be bussed. There is also a general, midterm letter from the Supervisor of Catholic schools noting difficulties with burgeoning schools. Lavatories and wash basin facilities were not keeping pace with expansions. The hallways were too drafty because entrances are not properly built for winter. There are reports of a general shortage of space in

"cloakrooms" for students and storage space for teachers.

Smaller schools had their own difficulties. The Diocese of Cleveland Superintendent sent out a letter informing these smaller schools that each elementary school must have at least three teachers and that no more than two grades could share a classroom.

My sisters attended school at Sacred Heart in Barberton. There were only four classrooms but there were eight grades taught by Dominican Sisters from Our Lady of the Elms. One of my sister's duties was to go to the office and answer the phone should it ring. As she tells it, one day she heard the phone ring and went down to the office and answered it becoming the first person in the school to know of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The school closed before I was able to attend.

There was also a growing body of students who did not attend parish schools and so information and questionnaires were sent out about the parish programs to teach these students in the knowledge and practice of the faith. Today we call these classes Parish School of Religion or PSR, but back then (and when I attended) it was known as the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine or CCD. There were also questions about "Religion Discussion Groups" and convert instruction classes which, at the time, were called, "Apostolate of Good Will." This is now known as the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults or RCIA. We currently have about 12 people coming into the Church this Easter through RCIA. Please say a prayer for them, our PSR students and our parish school students!
