# **WORK AROUND ST. SEBASTIAN SQUARE**




# **EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL APP**

# FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

The 1955 school folder contains information about programs in the diocese, at least one of which is worth noting. "In recent years, since becoming superintendent of schools, I have tried to give our school system the leadership of sound Catholic thinking. Especially as an effort has been made to dislodge and discard what were known to be, or considered to be erroneous, harmful, or obstructive principles, policies, and practices."

A number of examples were then listed but this one caught my eye: "The 'sight word' approach to reading has been abandoned in favor of an alphabetic and phonetic approach."

The reason I found this so fascinating is that in recent years, California switched to a sight word reading approach, which was considered cutting edge, with disastrous results in reading ability and comprehension. They have since abandoned it. Too bad they didn't read the 1955 Diocese of Cleveland report.

There was also the recommendation of beginning an acceleration program for gifted children.

In the diocesan "School News" bulletin, schools were given instructions on how eighth grade boys might apply to Borromeo High School Seminary (now closed). There was an article on, "Flickering and noisy florescent lights" that have been noted as "serious distractions and annoyances by several supervisors. The noise may call for replacing the ballast. Flicker causes serious eyestrain and nervous tension."

A letter from the Cleveland Safety Council was notifying the school of "Fire Prevention Week", first proclaimed by President Warren Harding in 1922 to recall the anniversary of the Chicago Fire. "It may be of interest to you to know that in 1953, 3,300 fires occurred in churches throughout the country, with an estimated loss of \$12,400,000."

Finally, the DOC Board of Education sent out a letter stating the Knights of Columbus were sponsoring a "Catholic Film Plan." They would "assemble through production and purchase a program of film with Catholic intent and teaching for the Catholic Film Distribution plan of the K of C." These films would have a favorable rating from the "Legion of Decency."

"After recent decision I find myself most reluctant to cooperate with the movie industry, feeling it might be easier to wean our children away from movies all together. I am willing to cooperate with the K of C to test whether the plan might prove of some benefit to our movie going children."

"Some of the movie houses on the list recently showed a 'condemned' film. They have given assurances of not repeating that.
