WORK AROUND ST. SEBASTIAN SQUARE

Starting this week, more of our sandstone sidewalk is being worked on. The location of this work is on the east side of the school, the side that runs along the rectory. Stone has been cut to replace broken pieces and at the intersection where the sidewalks crisscross, the stone will be lifted up. In recent years the stone there has been sinking and not only does water collect there, dirt and mud settles making the surface slippery and dangerous. This project should be finished by next week.

We look forward to the rectory plastering and painting work being completed by next week although I will miss the guys. They are a great crew and fun to be around. But it will be nice to be able to find things again and put them back where we are accustomed to them being.

About half of the lampposts are now working at the Perkins property (Good Park.) More sidewalks are being laid. Speaking of lamp posts, there is one on the walkway leading up to the rectory from the street. Until recently it was abnormally tall, silver and with a vastly undersized lamp casing at the top. It has always irritated me though nobody else seems to even recall that it existed. Anyway, our maintenance crew chopped off several feet of it, painted it black and stuck a new lamp on the top that we saved from the trash heap and now it looks marvelous! Thank you!

SEMINARY CLASS AT ST. SEBASTIAN

The Pre-theology Class (about ten men, which will include our own Christopher Villarreal and John Scantling) will be coming to St. Sebastian Parish on Monday for a class on art, beauty, and spirituality. 




The first picture is the augmented lamppost in front of the rectory.

FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

A November 1953 letter from the Diocesan Board of Education gives notice that Fire Chief Elmer Cain stated that the fire bell, "is to be used only as a signal for the evacuation of the school building in case of fire or at the time of a fire-drill - under no circumstances is the fire bell going to be used for any other type of signal or warning . . . For air raid and other drills in which pupils are not to leave the building, another bell or single e.g. the regular school bell is to be used."

In another letter, Captain Roth of the Juvenile Bureau of the Police Department shared with the diocese "a list of titles of obscene twenty-five cent pocketbooks and illustrated magazines which have been available to children on bookstands throughout the city. The immorality and perversion apparent even in the titles is shocking . . . In the battle with this million-dollar business, only coordinated action on a national scale will produce lasting results, but local actions are also necessary."

Isn't it interesting that we fight the same things today but with different particulars. We no longer have air-raid drills, but we do have active shooter drills. We no longer worry about 25 cent racy books but internet porn. The more things change . . .

Finally, here are some excerpts from a letter from the diocese concerning rules for prom:

1. All school-sponsored dances, proms, and other recreational activities must take place on the school premises,

except when specific permission for another arrangement has been obtained in advance from the Superintendent.

- 2. All evening events terminate so that the buildings can be cleared by 11:30pm. In the case of prom, 12 midnight.
- 3. All students must return directly home; the boy, after escorting his partner to her home. The girl is to be home by 1 a.m. and the boy by 2 a.m.
- 4. No visitation of any nightclub, tavern, inn, or similar place, nor of any eating place serving liquor or providing floor shows or similar entertainment is permitted prom included.
- 5. Permission to get a bite to eat after the prom in a respectable restaurant is reluctantly given.
