- Our Mother's Hands- Rosemary Reed gave a presentation on The Holy Face of Jesus at last Monday's Theology on the Rocks. There will be another presentation at St. Rita's in Solon, OH on Dec 3rd, and there are plans to speak in Columbus sometime in Feb 2026. OMH is switching to a new server and building a new website to offer on-line scheduling for the Vocation Crucifix and the Pilgrim Virgin Statue.
