

From the Principal's Office



Welcome to the new school year! I'm excited to welcome back our returning students, families, teachers and staff. I hope you all will join me in extending a warm welcome to our new students, families, and teachers as well.

St. Sebastian Parish School is a great community of education and faith, and I consider myself lucky to be helping to lead this community as we begin the 2018-19 school year.

New Teachers

We are pleased to welcome the following new teachers. Michelle Pillar will be teaching third grade. Michelle has 17 years of teaching experience, most recently in West Virginia. Megan Ritchie will be teaching junior high science and health. She comes to St. Sebastian after four years of teaching junior high at St. Mary's School in Massillon. Although not new to St. Sebastian, this year Scott Mason will take on the role of enrichment teacher, in addition to his roles as librarian and band director.

Dress Code

This year we have made several small changes to the dress code. I will summarize a few here, but please be sure to consult the dress code policy if you have any questions. Shoes: This year Sperry or topsider style shoes are acceptable, but please adhere to the non-marking soles requirement, and athletic or casual shoes are still not permitted. Socks: In addition to the traditional knee-high socks or tights, girls may wear any other style of sock that covers the ankle bone (no "no-show" styles). Physical Education: Students in grades 4-8 may wear any plain, solid color shirt or pair of shorts (no schoolpurchased shirt required). Dress Down: Leggings will be permitted as long as the sweater or blouse worn is fingertip length front and back. Shorts must also be fingertip length with no holes. Spirit Wear: Spirit Wear will be again be allowed on Fridays

except during Lent and Advent. Thank you for your cooperation in adhering to the dress code as we help our students learn to carry themselves with dignity as one of God's creations.

Junior High Spanish

This year the Spanish curriculum will undergo some major changes. Partly in response to parent surveys that requested stronger preparation for high school-level language learning, junior high students will be taking Spanish classes twice a week, with the goal of covering the coursework for a typical Spanish I class over the course of the two years of junior high. Palma Sferro will teach these classes in addition to teaching Spanish to younger students. More details will be provided soon. Thank you to the School Advisory Committee for their work on this initiative. Summer Updates

Thanks to our maintenance crew for all their hard work over the summer! In addition to their many annual cleaning and repair projects, they have replaced the carpet in three of the classrooms and installed four new Smartboards. In keeping with our technology plan and the widespread access many of our students have to Chromebook laptops (all students in grades 6-8 will be issued their own Chromebook again this year), the school purchased new Chromebooks for all of our K-8 teachers using funds dedicated to professional development. These "two-in-one" laptops have capabilities of both a tablet and a computer, and we are happy to provide our teachers with these great educational resources in an effort to further personalize the learning for each student.

Teacher Training

The week before school, our teachers will receive training related to the new Chromebooks as we welcome international Google expert Eric Curts to St. Sebastian once again. I have no doubt he will pass along a great deal of information and inspiration to our teachers! Our teachers and staff will also spend time reviewing and reinforcing the school's safety plan. Please know that school safety remains our top priority, and we consistently discuss, evaluate and update it as needs arise. The teachers will also spend one day together at the Jesuit Retreat House in Parma. The theme of the day's retreat is "Accompanying God's Children: The Gift and Vocation of Teaching." Attending Mass together and spending the day nourishing our minds and spirits is the perfect way to start the new school year. Here's to a whole year of nourishing the minds and spirits of your students!

From the STEM Coordinator



This past May was very busy for St. Sebastian students in the realm of STEM. Following our highly successful STREAM Night, we still had quite a bit of work to do! Students in grades six and eight embarked on visits to Camp Christopher, during which the sixth grade learned about erosion and brainstormed ways to help prevent it in the future. Meanwhile, the eighth-

graders had a crash course in biomimicry. It was the first step in forming a lasting partnership with Camp Christopher for many years to come. In the 2018-2019 school year we are planning to bring our seventh-graders back to camp to implement their erosion solutions, and the sixth- and eighth-graders will again return for more learning as well.

Our Gravity Racing Challenge team (grades 5-7) overcame tremendous odds and built five cars, all of which were raced on May 20 during the All-American Soap Box Derby's Gravity Racing Challenge. For a while, it looked as though we wouldn't be able to race at all, following the fire in the lab that damaged the cars and melted the protective Styrofoam parts. After replacing parts and passing inspections, all of our team members were given the opportunity to go down the famous hill once in a Soap Box Derby car during team day, and they had a ball! Unfortunately, on the day of the race, all of our cars came in second place in each heat, resulting in a much shorter race day than last year! All in all, the drivers had fun, and they learned about tools, cars, and teamwork. We will be racing four cars next year, and our team will be stronger than ever!

In June our Garden Club began meeting on Mondays for some harvesting and, well mostly, weeding. This year we had planned to transplant seedlings from the lab into our transformed garden, but God had other plans. The fire suffocated most of our seedlings, so we again had to purchase seedlings from Graf Growers. This year, since we were a bit late, we were limited in

our choices, so we are currently growing tomatoes, Brussels sprouts, celery, basil, cilantro, and collard greens. We have already harvested lettuce and lots of delicious strawberries, and we have purchased new polymer timber to create an additional 16 beds for next year. With God's grace we will begin anew in the spring and continue harvesting as much as we can for the Good Samaritan Hunger Center. I'd like to offer a special thank you to Anysia Reimund, Arabelle Loyed, Anne Rea, and the Petit and Rothkopf families for their help throughout the summer.

Also in June we had a small group of students attend the University of Akron's Women in Engineering Camp. This weeklong camp encouraged young ladies to explore various areas in the field of engineering. Attendees included Abbey Monaghan, Anne Rea, Fiona Yori, Sydney Borges, and Julia Pentasuglio. They went on a field trip every day and created multiple things including their own pinball machines! Julia went on to win an award for her bridge design. Nice work, ladies!

In August several teachers will be attending the Diocese of Cleveland's STREAM Academy to acquire new skills to share with their students this school year. I will also be teaching a module about our Global Cardboard Challenge to other teachers in the diocese. We love to share our gifts with others! In addition, our teachers will also be attending another Google workshop taught by Eric Curts. If you "Google him," you'll learn about all the amazing things he plans to present to our teachers. We will, in turn, share this knowledge with your children. We are looking forward to building upon our fantastic STEM foundation this year by incorporating even more technology and hands-on opportunities. Stay tuned!
