FROM THE FORGOTTEN CABINET

In 1961, a pamphlet was sent home to parents in the parish school concerning school policies. Some of them are the same that we have today, others are more interesting. The school was divided for Masses, the upper grades going to the "new" church and the lower to the "Children's Chapel," with the note that children must have breakfast by 8:00 A.M.

Boys were to buy their uniforms on the "2nd floor O'Neil's Boy's Department. Trousers: dark blue, Shirts: light blue and Tie: navy.

"Measurements (for girls) will be taken in September for jumpers and blouses. It is suggested that girls wear black and white saddle oxfords or a similar sensible type of school shoe. Tennis shoes or play shoes are not permitted."

Another section was entitled, "RUBBERS." "Whether your child walks, rides a bus, or is driven to school, he must wear rubbers in all inclement weather, Sundays included. We cannot be responsible for children wearing apparel that is likely to be lost in and around the school. We advise you to mark these articles clearly and permanently and, in this way, avoid much confusion and annoyance."

Lest you think that these rules were only for the students, these experts from the 1955 letter to the faculty should allay those misconceptions.

"Sister Bernice,

Please to inform Sister or Teacher at the door to give their attention to Children as they arrive.

- A) First to greet them.
- B) Second to see that they are wearing their rubbers on the bad days.

Please request Sister or Teacher to be in their respective Classroom no later than 8:15, and to have children seated at their desks as they arrive. If this is not observed, we must go back to the Auditorium for our Assembly. Note: In 1955, the auditorium was a large room in the basement of the school which now comprises the library and computer room.

There should be no eating in the classroom. If there is a birthday to be celebrated, the eating should take place in the Auditorium. We must keep our classrooms clean.

A boy should be appointed to raise and lower the flag on all school days, except in bad days."
