In addition to the on-line giving option, we have once again added offertory envelopes to the November packet that is mailed out to you for donations.



In 1947, Father Zwisler received a letter from St. Vincent High School stating that, "We know that you are interested in knowing the results of the scholarship examinations administered last Saturday. These tests were given to 57 boys and girls from 10 schools. The fifteen students having the highest average was as follows:"

Those fifteen students came from eight different schools as far away as Kent. St. Sebastian Parish School filled two of the slots which was pretty common among the eight schools. Charles Linton (Class of 1947) came in 5th and

James Obermier (Class of 1947) came in sixth. Charles received a year's free tuition because of his efforts!
