NO FOR NOVEMBER

It is possible that this time next year, a school will not be able to take your child to the museum or even take your child's picture without your knowledge and expressed permission, but they may be able to take them for reproduction medical procedures without your knowledge or consent and leaving you with no legal recourse. That is the tricky wording of Issue 1 coming up this November. This is not hyperbole nor rhetoric. It is also not just a matter of religion, though some want to package it that way. It is a matter of humanity. For decades we have been told, "Just a little further and no more," only to find that it is never enough. If this legislation passes, do not think that this unrestrained access to abortion for anyone for any reason will stay in its tidy box.

It is time for those who truly care for humanity, who want to preserve a parent's rights, who want to protect children and women to vote NO in NOvember on Issue One. Even many of those who are for abortion within certain parameters are appalled at what this legislation allows. This is an issue for those who want to preserve our dignity as human persons, not just for Catholics who care for life and salvation of souls. Please make sure that you are registered and make it a top priority to vote NO in NOvember on Issue One.
