REPORT ON BISHOP MALESIC'S VISIT

On Monday, the Feast of the Guardian Angels, Bishop Malesic came to St. Sebastian Parish School to help us continue our celebration of the school earning the National Blue-Ribbon Award. The children, available parents, some of our benefactors, faculty, staff, Fr. Bozek and I had Mass with our bishop who praised the school and parish for achieving this great honor. The seventh and eighth grade choir sang magnificently, and our servers were praised by the Bishop's Master of Ceremonies.

The Mayor was unable to join us owing to a funeral, but he promised to come to another event to offer his congratulations. But he did send a proclamation for the day. Because of the school's high academic achievement and because it was one of only forty private schools recognized and one of only nineteen schools recognized in the state of Ohio, the proclamation read in part, "Now therefore: I, Daniel Horrigan, Mayor of the City of Akron, Ohio, do hereby proclaim Monday, October 2, 2023 as "ST. SEBASTIAN PARISH SCHOOL DAY" in the city of Akron and ask all residents to congratulate the clergy, educators, staff, students, and families at St. Sebastian Parish School for receiving the prestigious National Blue Ribbon Award by the U.S. Department of Education."

The Secretary of Education, Miguel A. Cardona Ed.D. sent a proclamation also that reads in part, "Your distinction as a 2023 National Blue-Ribbon School also is a testament to your school's intentional collaboration with parents, families, and your broader community to wrap students in care for their overall well-being and to provide them with rich well-rounded, and engaging learning experiences. Your practices are serving as a model for schools across the United States."

After the Mass, the Bishop and representatives from the education office of the diocese went on a tour of the school with some of our eighth-grade student ambassadors. The Bishop was most interested in our Computer Lab, the Innovation Lab and our Science Room (he being a biologist.) He visited a class in each section of the school and then we went to the rectory for a light lunch provided by Marcy Smith.

But the day wasn't over yet! The entourage then paraded up to the <u>Julie Billiart School, Akron</u> to bless the new prayer room and to visit a couple of the classes there. It was a great day for our parish and schools. Thank you so much to everybody who made the day possible.

Funny side story pointing to the fact that we may be celebrating a bit much: One of our moms put a toilet bowlcleaning disk in the water reservoir at home, which of course turned the water blue. Her child asked, "Mom! Did you do this because we won the blue ribbon?!"

My sister took ballet lessons from Mrs. Cover in her studio at her home . . . which is now where there is a legal office building."

And their sister, featured in the cast as Alice, Sister Mary Catherine Hilkert (Class of 1962), O.P., is now a professor in the Department of Theology at University of Notre Dame. Accompanying and singing was Sister Mary Canisius.

In 1955 the sixth graders performed, "The Haunted Tea Room", The Willowmere Tea Room and Inn has a reputation of harboring a ghost, who walks at midnight. Storm bound at the Inn the night of our play, several youngsters set out to solve the mystery and what a night of it they do have!"
