The obituary comes out right away but says a service will be held at a later date. Is there a way to get word out to the parishioners when the service is actually scheduled? Ed	<ul> <li>SVDP: Pretty good on membership and being able to cover assignment cards. Requests for assistance are running at a normal pace, with requests for rent assistance slightly up since the eviction moratorium has now expired. We refer persons who may be eligible under the Summit Cares program where possible. Received a monetary distribution from a local, private family foundation, which when added to other periodic donations received through the red envelope collection and the poor box, should place us in decent financial shape for at least the calendar year 2022.</li> <li>As has been the practice for years, we continue not to assign female members of the group to that part of the parish demarked by Copley Road to the north, Diagonal Road to the east and south, and Crestview Ave to the west. Although all of our activity takes place during daylight hours the local news still reports too many drive-by shootings, burglaries.</li> <li>Keeping track of CDC guidance as well as local COVID figures before deciding to re-institute the long-standing Vincentian policy of home visits in all cases. Not quite there yet, although Omicron numbers have precipitously declined in Summit County the last couple of weeks and the hospitalizations at Summa, Cleveland Clinic and Childrens are way down during that time frame.</li> <li>SOCIAL JUSTICE: No report.</li> </ul>
