THE U. S. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION RECOGNIZES ST. SEBASTIAN PARISH SCHOOL AS ONE OF THE BEST IN THE NATION!

On Tuesday, the school day started off with Mass and my homily was about how, not only do we have a great school academically where we can prepare our students well for this life, but we also give thanks that we can prepare them well for the life to come by worshipping God and learning from Him the best way to live. The school then stayed for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament since we were still in the midst of our Forty Hours of Devotion.

At one o'clock, the entire school was invited down to Zwisler Hall for a surprise assembly. As the students left the classrooms, a team of Sebastianites hung blue banners and flags, put treat bags in the each of the classrooms, and chalked the sidewalk blue. "Do you have *any* idea what this is all about," I asked the students, and they didn't have a clue even though Mr. Rohr had on all blue and I was wearing a blue blazer and blue socks, which is unusual for me. I think the teachers were suspicious, however.

Mr. Rohr took command of the room and reminded us that our Center for Early Learning had been voted the "Best of the Best" last year in an Akron Beacon Journal pole. Then he announced that we had just been awarded the Governor's Thomas Edison Award for Stem Excellence for the fifth year in a row and that nineteen of our teachers were specifically named.

But then came the big announcement: St. Sebastian Parish School was one of the few from across our country to be named by the U. S. Department of Education as a National Blue-Ribbon School! The crowd went wild. The band played our fight song, and all yelled out, "SAINT SE-BAST-IAN!" I've been to many stadiums and many games, but no sound level could match the joyful shout that came out from those students unless one happened to be standing directly behind a jet revving its engines.

Then we watched the national broadcast as we received congratulations from the Secretary of Education and then they started listing awarded schools. Of course, it was in alphabetical order beginning by states. "Alabama . . ." I never consider being from Ohio an ordeal, but by alphabetical standards it was a trial that day. And then, when we got to Ohio, they went alphabetically through the schools that won in her boarders. Having "Saint" as the first part of your title put us, again, way at the end of the list.

As we got closer and closer to the "S"s, the tensions and excitement in the room grew. Of course, we were not the only "Saint . . ." on the list so we agonizingly had to wait through all of the saints who had names in the alphabet before Sebastian. But then, finally, the picture of "St. Sebastian Parish School" finally came up and the student body went wild.

The celebration continued with blue donuts. When everyone was back in the classroom, the kids received some blue treats and mementos including whistles which, only in retrospect, did I realize may have been a mistake. (My apologies parents) The teachers were instructed to head to the teacher's lounge after school to pick up a little memento for themselves: blue cookies in the form of a blue-ribbon award baked by Marcy Smith and tiny bottles of champagne to have a toast with at home over dinner.

It was a great (and exhausting) day. There are more celebrations to come. Notably, there will be a Mass with our Bishop, the mayor will be on hand to issue a proclamation, and the diocesan school administration will be here on hand to help us celebrate on Monday, October 2 at 10:00am.

Congratulations to Mr. Rohr, our faculty, support staff, parents and community that came together to make this possible. God bless you!


