School Currently have 335 students in the school. Current 8th grade graduating class is larger than other grades, but we believe with current registered and pending registrations, and potential new families that have toured school will be able to maintain the numbers for next year. Spectacular Net Profit \$135,000 which was probably one of our top fundraising years \$53,000 will go to Z-hall media/audio updates - will be added to the \$20,000 raised on giving tuesday. \$82,000 will go into the school general funds - usually allocated to different things like technology upgrades, tuition reduction, etc. Financials YTD - Contributions are up significantly favorable to last year by \$400,000, Expenses are about the same. Net Net YTS is \$300,000 - - include payroll credit and covid funds - those are extraordinary – if removed we would be on par with last year. School revenue is favorable, expenses are inline with last year so we are up • State of the Facility – went through each building what is done and what needs to be done. Major issue is the church roof is leaking. Roof has tile, felt composite, and water goes to the tile, on to the fet and drained to the gutters. But it's leaking. The felt is falling apart. Fix is estimated at \$150,000 - not sure if it will fix - New roof is estimated to be \$400,000 - \$500,000. Will discuss at the next meeting to determine what to do. Next meeting is April 28th.
